Curriculum Highlights:

Science:

Our Stone Lakes Eagles will learn to raise questions about the natural world, use appropriate reference materials that support understanding to obtain information, conduct both individual and team investigations through free exploration and systematic investigations, and generate appropriate explanations based on those explorations.

Math:

In Grade 4, instructional time should focus on three critical areas: (1) developing understanding and fluency with multi-digit multiplication and division; (2) developing an understanding of fraction equivalence, addition and subtraction of fractions with like denominators, and multiplication of fractions by whole numbers; (3) understanding that geometric figures can be analyzed and classified based on their properties.
